| Making sure hands are clean before eating is important. Make a weeklong personal calendar for each student. (A calendar template is available in the digital resources.) They can place an X or a sticker on each day that they remember to wash their hands before they eat. Have students look at the calendars at the end of the week to see how they did. | Explain that washing hands should last as long as it takes to sing the alphabet song. Ask students to practice singing as they wash. Do this with the whole group a few times to practice, and celebrate students when they wash their hands for the appropriate length of time. | Let students know one way we can keep each other safe from illnesses is by not spreading our germs to others. Have students write their names on sheets of paper. Then, ask students to draw themselves making good choices that keep them from spreading germs to others. |

| Sometimes, students may see other students sneeze into their hands or forget to wash their hands. Have students practice kind reminders. Tell students that the goal with these reminders is to help others, not to embarrass others. | Have students decorate paper germs. Then, spread them around the room as a reminder that germs are all over the place. (A germs template is available in the digital resources.) | This book lists 10 beneficial times to wash hands. Have students recall as many of them as they can. Then, create a chart of the good times to wash your hands as a reminder for students. Additionally, a handwashing coloring page is available in the digital resources. Have each student color the page to keep for themselves. |
